Self-confidence is a person's belief towards all aspects of one's own advantage and confidence made him feel able to achieve goals in life. Moreover confident personality is also a most important aspect of the human person.

Cheating behavior is the frequency of a person's level of desire to commit a fraudulent, dishonest, and where a person uses a variety of ways to get the desired results without any effort to learn and understand the material. Cheating behaviors have a negative impact on the future development of the youth so that youth feel difficulties in the formation of a moral code because it is not consistent right and wrong in everyday life.

The purpose of this study was to determine the level of confidence, cheating behavior of students in MA Salafiyah Bangil Pasuruan confident relationship with the cheating behavior of students in MA Salafiyah Bangil Pasuruan. This research is quantitative research. The research was conducted in MA Salafiyah Bangil Pasuruan. With a population of 120 students and took a 50% sample of 60 students. And the data obtained in this study support the data documentation.

Based on the analysis of the study found the following results: the confidence variable produces 49siswa (81.67%) had high confidence, 10siswa (16.67%) had moderate confidence, and 1 student (1.6%) had low self-esteem. While the cheating behavior variables produce 37 students (61.67%) had a high cheating behavior, 23 students (38.33%) had a moderate cheating behavior, and 0 students (0%) had a low cheating behavior.

The results of confidence and cheating behavior produces (rxy 0288; with sig> 0:05). That is, the relationship between the variables and Behavior Confidence Cheating is not significant with a negative gain value and significance value Sig0 0.26, 83. (2-tailed) is above or greater than 0.05. Effective contribution or the confident prediction of the behavior demonstrated by the student cheating determinant coefficient $r^2 = 0.083$, which means that 8.3% of cheating behavior is determined by confidence.
