

ABSTRACT

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Adolescent is a transitional stage of life and that is not steady. Beside , adolescent is a vulnerable period by the negative influences, such as drugs, crime and sex crimes. One of the adolescent phenomenon that really stands out is the increased of interest and motivation toward sexuality. The increased attention to adolescent sexual greatly influenced by the physical changes during puberty and adolescent sexual stimulus, than make a curiosity for sexuality. To master the important developments in the establishment of a new relationship and a more mature with the opposite sex and the exact role played by sex, adolescent need to get the self-concept possessed since childhood. The self-concept possessed adolescent will affect their behavior in social relationships with other individuals. If the adolescent who has a negative self-concept will tend to perform sexual behaviors outside of marriage, because there is no respect for themselves and are emotionally unstable and immature personality. However, adolescents who have positive self-concept will tend to not perform deviant behaviors such as having sex before marriage, self-esteem due to the emotional maturity of adolescents. From this thought the researchers want to know how the correlation between self-concept and premarital sexual behavior in student high school Cokoraminoto of Malang.

This study aims to increase the level of self-concept, pre-marital sexual behavior in students and the correlation between self-concept with behavior of premarital sex. This research is quantitative, the sample is taken the whole class X and class XI all students with a total of 61 students. The class XII was not taken because of the national exams. Data collection by using the method of documentation, interviews, observation and questionnaires. Data obtained from questionnaires were analyzed by Product Moment correlation technique using a computer program SPSS (Statistical Product And Service Solution) 17.00 for windows.

The conclusion is the concept himself at a high level of 21, 31%, then at a medium level of 65, 57 and at low levels by 13, 12%. Premarital sexual behavior of students at high levels by 27, 86%, then at a medium level of 57, 38% and at low levels by 14, 76%. From the results of correlation analysis concluded that there was no significant correlation or relationship ($r_{xy} = -0.96$: sig. = $0.05 < 0.460$) between Self-concept and Premarital sex behavior in student high school Cokroaminoto of Malang. It also mean the researchers that the hypothesis is rejected.
