

## ABSTRACT

Shofa, Abdus Mohammad 2014. Relationships of Parenting Parents with juvenile delinquency on the students of SMAN 1 Kepohbaru, Bojonegoro. Supervisor: Dr. Iin Tri Rahayu, M.Si

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Adolescence is a time of great importance in the process of growth and development of children, because in this period was a time of transition from the child toward adulthood. The role of parents is becoming very important in parenting. With proper parenting, child will grow up becoming better personal, or vice versa.

The objective of this research is to know the relationship of parenting parents with juvenile delinquency, parenting trends and levels of delinquency on students of SMAN 1 Kepohbaru, Bojonegoro. This research is quantitative research correlation. The sample in this research totalled 57 students of SMAN 1 Kepohbaru, from 162 students starting classes X to XII classes which taken by clustering random sampling techniques. The variable X is a parent's Parenting and the variable Y is juvenile delinquency. To measure the parenting parents, the researchers use the parenting parents question form, while to measure levels of juvenile delinquency on the students of SMAN 1 Kepohbaru, the researcher uses juvenile delinquency questionnaire.

Based on the results of data questionnaire parenting parents, from 57 respondents total 19,31% or 11 students using a democratic, there are 24,56% or 14 student use of authoritarian parenting, there are 26,31 or 15% students use permissive parenting, and 29,82% or 17 students use parenting uninvolved, from thus the highest tendency of students in SMAN 1 Kepohbaru which parents used is Uninvolved Parenting. According to the second data, the result of the calculation for the juvenile delinquency questionnaire, 57 respondents get 7 (12.3%), had a high level of delinquency, 41 respondents (71.9%) are at the medium level of delinquency. 9 respondents (15.8 %) are at a low level of delinquency, from thus students of SMA Negeri 1 Kepohbaru have medium levels of delinquency. The results of correlation showed that  $r_{hit}$  democratic parenting is 0,673,  $r_{hit}$  authoritarian parenting was 0,804,  $r_{hit}$  permissive parenting is 0,518, and  $r_{hit}$  uninvolved parenting is 0,492 with the  $r_{tabel}$  value 0,273  $r_{hit} > r_{tabel}$  ( $p < 0.05$ ) for a significant level of 5%, which means that there is a positive significant relationship between parenting parents with juvenile delinquency.
