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ABSTRACT

This research focuses on figurative meaning of Rich Brian song lyric and its illustration of his identity. Figurative meaning is language style used by people to communicate. Then, from the songs, people could convey their feeling, conditions and their desire. Identity people need to construct the language use. Drawing upon the theory of figurative language and identity, this study explores the shaping identity of someone through language use. Moreover, this study focuses on types of figurative meaning and identity, how constructs the language to show the identity based on the figurative meaning use in the song's lyrics. The method used in this study is qualitative, because the purpose of this study to described the utterance of the sentence that is categorized into figurative meaning. which uses to show the personal identity. The object of this research is song from Rich Brian. There are eight songs in the song's album of Rich Brian. Whereas, data source was taken from Spotify.

The results of the study indicated that are eight figurative meaning used by Rich Brian's song lyrics. They are personification, smile, hyperbole, metaphor, irony, litotes, metonymy and oxymoron. The researcher finds two used by songwriter that contained the figurative meaning. Those data consist of personification 8 (4%), simile 8 (4%), metaphor 57 (28,5%), hyperbole 37 (19,5%), irony 51 (25,5%), litotes 12 (6%), metonymy 19 (9,5%) and oxymoron 6 (3%). The most dominant figurative meaning found in this research is Metaphor and the total is 57 (28,5%) Metaphor. Furthermore, the identity representation seen from figurative meaning it shows that the personal identity of the songwriter based on his character and his uniqueness that makes him differ from other. Meanwhile, the character of the songwriter is mostly good even though in the past he is very far from God's rules, but with his extraordinary determination he could become a better person. Besides that, Rich Brian uses a different arrangement from others. That's what makes him a uniqueness songwriter and make him differ from other. This research is supported by previous research in terms of theory. However, this research is different. This study has limitations in word level analysis, especially in the analysis of figurative meaning and identity, therefore for further researchers it is suggested to dig up other value for example social value, and humanity value that are determined from figurative meaning in poetry or speech on Gaza tragedy today.

Data tersebut terdiri dari tiga kalimat yaitu personifikasi 8 (4%), simile 8 (4%), metafora 57 (28,5%), hiperbola 37 (19,5%), ironi 51 (25,5%), litotes 12 (6%), metonimi 19 (9,5%) dan oksimoron 6 (3%). Makna kiasan yang paling dominan ditemukan dalam penelitian ini adalah Metafora dan totalnya sebanyak 57 (28,5%) Metafora. CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

A. Research Background

Literature displays in terms of compiling stories that are imaginative or factual regardless of the information. Therefore, literature is divided into two, namely imaginative and informative literature. Among imaginative literature, song lyrics are included in that section. As for literary works: novels, poetry and songs need beautiful and interesting language so that readers can enjoy and understand these points. Song is part of literature that is imaginative.

In this problem to learn and understand language is not only understanding the form of language, but there are many meanings contained therein. There are many ways that can be done so that one can understand and be able to capture every problem and idea from each song and there are also many ways to find out the ideas or meaning of each song. Through songs, people can convey their voice to many people, so that someone can know their feelings and ideas. That is, songs can be used as a way of conveying ideas and feelings that people can understand what the composer means. Related to this study deals with figurative meaning in which the language is analyzed based on words or expressions that describe the meaning of sound.

Figurative meaning is the language used imaginatively to mean something different from the ordinary meaning. According to Kuennedy (1991:584) states figures of speech are a departure from the ordinary form of expression or the ordinary course of ideas in order to produce a greater effect. When a researcher uses language literally, they only state the facts as they are. The figurative meaning is a real or imaginary meaning that moves our imagination. The meaning of the words can also be influenced by the words that are around the sentence. Figurative

meaning shows the beauty of language and some of the creators of books, songs, and motivators use figurative meaning to express their feelings through the language so that this figurative meaning has a very important role for the author and figurative meaning can also beautify a literary work.

There are many views on the use of figurative language and there is no rule that the use of language is only one in a sentence. Writers can write more than one language in a sentence. Figurative language makes sentences more interesting and people also prefer to use figurative language because it helps listeners or readers feel more nuanced. Figurative language is understood by understanding the meaning of a word or phrase in a sentence and then relating it to the context in which the figurative language occurs to understand the hidden meanings and messages understood by the researcher or speaker. Humans need linguistic skills to interpret and distinguish figurative meaning from the literal meaning. There are many types of figurative meanings that people find and use in their conversations, For Example. The stars in the sky blinked and winked (personification), he was as sweet as honey (simile), and Time is money (metaphor). The figurative meaning is an interesting study to analyze. Figurative language beautifies and refines speech. Some of the metaphorical expressions that are also contained in the song require detailed analysis. Each utterance conveys its own meaning. Seeing the understanding of figurative language and the application of figurative meaning is the choice of many songwriters. Based on the previous explanation, this study aims to analyze the use of figurative meanings in Rich Brian's songs. The reason the researcher chose Rich Brian's songs is that the songs contain a lot of meaning.

Music has become a part of youth and social life. On average literature student spend more than 2.45 hours per day listening to music (Delsing et al., 2008). Adolescents even place music listening above all other leisure activities when it comes to their interests (North & Hargreaves, 1999). Music listening is more than just a leisure activity since adolescents also use music as a technique to enhance their mood and thus,

it may help to battle internal problems such as depression and anxiety (Gabhainn et al., 2010). In addition, song plays a role important source of identity construction and a sense of self throughout life teenager. This is accentuated in the life-period of adolescence since developing one's identity is one of the most salient developmental tasks during this time (Mulder et al., 2010). However, it is still largely unclear whether musical preference played a role in formation identity education and clarity of self-concept.

Many of us have a hobby of listening to music, and among that music there are various genres, some songs have lyrics and some do not. Music that has lyrics usually we call it a song, because it has lyrics in it. From this, a song lyricist will pour all the stories that he wants to convey, by providing words that reflect the purpose of the song to be conveyed to listeners well, so that the song becomes a good unity. Nowadays there are many types of songs with various lyrical meanings, from love to sadness, each of which can reflect the intent of the song's lyricist. Some songs have titles and lyrics with figurative words. Figurative words are words that are very informal, not in the literal sense of the word; figurative Meaning is used to give a sense of elegance and emphasize the importance of what is being conveyed.

The song was created with an aesthetic to convey it beautifully. Song lyrics do not create lyrics as if they were writing news. The words used are embellished with a certain style of language to make it seem more poetic. In fact, do some song writers adopt the poem they made and then turn it into a song. Song has become an important thing for human life. There is a figurative meaning in English which says "Song makes the world go round". Because song is often your friend when you are working, when you are happy, and when you are sad. Song serves as a medium to express one's feelings, emotions, and ideas. These emotions are expressed through songs or musical rhythms. There is music that has a cheerful, warm, heart-wrenching atmosphere, and so on. A writer naturally creates

a song with multiple meanings and expresses his feelings through the song, and a singer or poet uses literal and figurative words for the song's appeal.

This research examines a song by Rich Brian in the context of a figurative meaning that is not well known to many people. By focusing on the discussion of figurative meaning and paying attention from every song feed in Rich Brian's song. From this research it is also very important to know so that the listeners of the song can find out the meaning of each of the verses of the song. From Rich Brian song that has been identified as having many important values. In this way the listeners of the song can be inspired to know and understand the song better and correctly.

Rich Brian is a 23-year-old teenager from Jakarta who made history as the first Asian artist to occupy the first position on iTunes for hip hop music. Rich Brian became a conversation on the world stage because of his phenomenal song. Rich Brian was chosen to be a music icon in Asia and represents Indonesia as a youth identity which certainly influences the nation's children in Indonesia. One of the most phenomenal songs from Rich Brian, namely Dat Stick, was watched by more than 100 million viewers.

the reason the authors take this research was due to the phenomenally of a young man named Rich Brian and succeeded in becoming the first person in Asia to introduce a song with the Hip-hop genre and Rich Brian also indirectly became an identity for the Indonesian state, so this research was conducted to find out more about the meaning of the song from the academic created by Rich Brian and incorporating identity theory because Rich Brian indirectly became the face of Indonesia for Asian and of course this research is very good for research and also as an example for young children in Indonesia.

Some previous studies have been done. First research from completed by Fadilah and Rohaniyah (2018). Entitled "The Analysis of Hyperbole and Synecdoche in Jokowi's Political Speeches On 2014 And 2015 Live on Metro TV". The similarity is that these two-research focus

on analysis figurative language in speech and the researchers also using the same method of qualitative descriptive.

Another research By Horvat, Ana Werkmann, Marianna Bolognesi, and Aditi Lahiri (2021). The processing of literal and metaphorical terms is examined in this work as it relates to methodological concerns with experimental investigations. The paper's primary goal is to explore methodological issues that have come up in recent experimental studies on figurative language, such as the use of heterogeneous stimuli and their suitability for examining issues with figurative language processing. The contextual and cognitive dominance of literal and metaphorical interpretations in polysemous words as a significant variable in experimental research on figurative language is at the center of the methodological controversy.

Nursolihat, Siti, and Evie Kareviati (2021). Their research, they attempt to decipher the meaning of the metaphorical language found in the song "A Whole New World" by examining the context in which it is used. This research is descriptive and qualitative. The music lyrics used as the data instrument were acquired from the Genius website.

Then, Syafitri, Dewi, and Melisa Marlinton (2018). The goal of the study was to identify the many types and connotations of figurative language found in Edgar Allan Poe's poetry. The eight poems of Edgar Allan Poe were titled "Annabel Lee, The Sleeper, A Dream Within a Dream, To One in Paradise, Alone, Spirit of the Dead, The Lake, and Evening Stars". Data classification and analysis using a descriptive qualitative method. Research in libraries served as the method for gathering the data. The researchers used qualitative descriptive to analyze the data in the meantime. The researchers uncovered 96 figurative languages after looking into the types and meanings of 8 poems by Edgar Allan Poe.

Base on the previous studies above the academic benefit of this research is to understand the meaning of a semantic perspective, especially with regard to song and identity. Nevertheless, the aim of this study is to

demonstrate the originality of current research by bridging the gap in terms of searching for identity through music and combining the notions of music and identity as well as providing an academic perspective on the meaning related to terms, is very important for further research. In addition, the academic function has a non-academic role, namely determining ways make decisions based on individual attitudes and their relation to meaning in the emotional and social domains. In addition, it can improve understanding of view semantics. Therefore, those who listen to music will be more than happy to be influenced by this research. In addition, the explanation from this study is good for everyday use as an initial understanding for music listeners. This research is focused on the use of affective and social-semantics to analyze research results. In addition, this study also uses a descriptive method to examine the data. In addition, it is important to study because of the academic point of view. This research can increase several advantages reference in understanding the meaning of words in music. Therefore, this research is intended to fill the gap of previous research.

C. Significance of the Study

The researcher makes this study intended to be used as an appropriate reference for further research on the analysis of figurative meanings in Rich Brian song lyrics. Practically shows that there are several categories in the song. In the analysis of a song there are many factors that need to be known thoroughly. So that it can have a positive or negative impact. By understanding what each song means, it will make song lovers able to understand every meaning of the song.

D. Scope and Limitations

The scope of this research is semantics. The limitation of this research is focused on figurative meaning. This research use type of figurative meaning in analyzing Rich Brian's song's Lyrics, such as; personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbole, and metonymy.

Then the researcher limits to investigate the words but the researcher will analyze in every sentence which contained the figurative meaning and how the way figurative meaning can represent the song's writer identity. Besides that, in this research the researcher will only analyze five song lyrics from the album "The sailor" by Rich Brian such as Yellow, Kids, kids, Drive safe, Confetti, Vacant, No worries and Slow down Turbo. Because in the song's album there are any types of figurative meaning that the songwriter's uses in every state.

E. Definition of Key Terms

- a. Figurative meaning: Figurative meaning is the language used imaginatively to mean something different from the ordinary meaning
- Song lyrics are words that make up a song usually consisting of verses and choruses. According to me, song lyrics are abstract, almost unintelligible and in such cases, their explication emphasizes form, articulation, meter, and symmetry of expression. A lyric is a paper written by someone who has imagination in composing beautiful words that have deep meaning.

CHAPTER II

REVIEW OF RELATED LITERATURE

Theory is the most important thing to put forward in research because it can be combined with scientific research itself to accept the same concept of each variable between readers and writers. The concept leads to a better analysis of variables because it helps researchers to narrow the scope of the problem. In addition, theory is also useful as a theory based on analysis.

A. Semantics

Semantics is the study of meaning communicated through language (Saeed, 2009:3). According to Kreidler (1998:3), semantics is the systematic study of meaning, and linguistic semantics is study of how languages organize and express meaning. It means that meaning in linguistic semantics is needed to limit ourselves to the expressions of meanings in a single language. Saeed (2009:3), states that a person's language abilities are based on the knowledge that they have, the speakers of a language have different types of linguistic knowledge, including how to pronounce words, how to construct sentences, and about the meaning of individual words and sentences. According to Keraf (2006:26) meaning is defined as relationship between form and its reference. This collection of memories gives an advantage to the most general or literal meaning, but also suggests reasons to see the difference meaning. Translating language into meaning is not easy; people have to do it looking at the relationship between language and context in creating interpretations.

One of the ways languages change over time is by speakers shifting the meaning of words to fit new conditions (Saeed 2009:15). People like to suggest that the word doesn't mean what they might very clearly mean, there is a difference between language and meaning. It means the language is coming and continues to grow; people use language more creatively to show language skills and reflect his personal.

B. Figurative meaning

According to Saeed (2009:15), there are two types of meaning. They are literal meaning and non-literal meaning that traditionally called figurative. Literal Meaning is an original meaning of word, phrase, and sentences. Meanwhile Figurative meaning is a departure from the ordinary form of expression in order to produce a greater effect or meaning.

a. Figurative Meaning

Figurative meaning is the language used imaginatively to mean something different from the ordinary meaning (Tarigan: 1985). Kuennedy (1991:584) states figures of speech are a departure from the ordinary form of expression or the ordinary course of ideas in order to produce a greater effect. It means figurative language is a way of saying something other than the literal meaning of the word. Literal means exactly what it says; meanwhile figurative means something different from their ordinary meaning in order to emphasize an idea.

In traditional analysis words in literal expressions denote what they mean according to common or dictionary usage, while the word in figurative expressions connote, they add layers of meaning. People can use language literally or figuratively. According to Keraf (2006:113) in expressing the idea, either the speaker or the writer has different ways. In other words, they might have different styles whereas others could give any judgment to their personality, mind and also their capability in using the language. People can use language figuratively in order to get greater effect, to make language more interesting and stylish. There are many kinds of figurative language where in its basic function it always departs from literal meaning to achieve a special effect or meaning.

E.g.: Figurative meaning

- 1. She drives his bicycle like the lightning
- 2. I am not telling her a fairly tale

The sentences above show the quite clear the differences between literal meaning and figurative meaning. The examples of literal meaning and figurative meaning above means the same thing, but figurative meaning using language more creative and stylish in order to achieve special effect of the meaning itself for the listener or reader. The basic distinction between literal meaning and figurative meaning where the speaker speak exact meaning, factually accurate way or the speaker describes something in untrue or impossible feeling in order to achieve special effects or meaning.

People use language figuratively to make beautiful words, to help them make things clearer or to achieve special effect or meaning in their conversation or any literary work. For instance, as a media, song is considered to be an important art form of literary work, and as a source of popular entertainment. In writing song lyrics, songwriter can use figurative meaning in their song lyrics in order to affect the listener to feel the meaning more interesting. Using language figuratively is another way of adding extra dimension of language so that the listener or readers can be interested in our expression.

C. Types of Figurative meaning

Leech (2010:2) in Macrothink Institute's Journal (2017:1948-5425) has classified, there are many types of figurative meaning. Figurative meaning has eight types. They are: personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbole, irony, litotes, metonymy, and oxymoron.

a. Personification

Perrine (1992) defines personification as a way of giving attributes of a human being to an animal, an object, or a concept. Personalization consists in giving human characteristics to an object. In fact, personification is the transfer of human characteristics to an object, animal or abstract idea. It makes animals and objects speak or behave like humans.

E.g.:

1. The Dog speak to my friend to not forget with his culture.

2. The Ball danced playfully in the field.

b. Simile

Simile means to compare two different and different things in one unit while some similarity exists in several attributes. A simile is a brief comparison, usually introduced by "like" or "as" (Kane, 1988:296). Bentley (1972) says that simile is the comparison of two objects, which are totally unlike but possess some features that are common in both.

c. Metaphor

A metaphor is a figure of speech in which is an implicit comparison in which two unlike objects are compared by identifying or substituting one with another. It is stated that a figure of speech which makes a comparison between two seemingly unlike things is called Metaphor (Macmillan, 1987:70). According to Bentley (1972) metaphor is a comparison that does not use words such as "like" and "as" but identifies one object with another.

E.g.:

- 1. You are my power
- 2. Time is money

d. Hyperbole

A hyperbole is a figure of speech in which the author makes an obvious exaggeration to create a rhetorical effect and deforms facts by making them appear much bigger than they are if looked at objectively. As Perrine (1992) says, it is an overstatement that is in the service of truth. It is used to create humor and sensational effect to make ideas more manipulative hence exploiting the listener.

E.g.:

1. If I can't buy phone, I will crazy

2. I will die, if I cant't pass the exam

e. Irony

Irony consists of using words in a sense very different from their usual meaning (S. Kane, 1988:313). Irony is the use of words to convey the opposite of their literal meaning; a statement or situation where the meaning is contradicted by the appearance or presentation of the idea. Irony can divide into soft irony and hard irony, soft irony usually used as humor and hard irony usually used as sarcastic.

E.g.:

- 1. When you dance, your dance is very good, it makes me want to go when you dance.
- 2. Nice! Now you have broken my laptop.

f. Litotes

Litotes is a type of figurative meaning; it is almost the opposite of hyperbole or usually the speaker makes a softer word. It consists of an understatement and usually known as a negative hyperbole.

E.g.:

- 1. This phone is not really bad
- 2. It is no ordinary village

g. Metonymy

According to Dale in Tarigan (1985:139) stated that metonymy comes from Greeks word which is Meta means switch and Metonymy means name. Metonymy is a figure of speech where the name of one thing is replaced with the name of something that is closely associated with it. A name transfer takes place to demonstrate an association of a part or how two things are

associated in some way. This allows the reader to recognize similarities or common features among terms.

E.g.:

- 1. They has Malboro in their pocket- Malboro means cigarette
- 2. My brother seldom drink C1000-C1000 means water

Oxymoron

An oxymoron is a figure of speech that aligns the elements that seem extraordinary. Oxymoron is a paradoxical combination of words or expressions with opposite that is more or less straightforwardly antonymic senses (Alm- Arvius, 2003:134).

E.g:

- 1. Beautifully painful
- 2. Happy sad

h. Rich Brian's song

Songs from Rich Brian are songs that have many meanings and these songs generally talk about life and things that usually occur in humans. Songs from Rich Brian also express a lot of feelings such as grief, love, disappointment, and cetera. Most of his expressions use figure of speech so that sometimes it is difficult to understand the meaning of the song lyrics. Figurative meaning in song from Rich Brian to speech comprehensive because it leads listeners to a broader understanding. Here are some of Rich Brian's songs written by famous writers; Yellow, Kids, Drive Safe, Confetti, Vacant, No Worries, Slow Down Turbo, 100 Degrees.

Every song of rich Brian's song has meaning, that is allegory and from this there is a lot that is not known especially in certain meanings. In figurative words, namely using utterances. Rich Brian's song has a figurative meaning and which is rarely used in everyday life, such as in songs. This is a tool for writers to visualize their thought-out songs to make them more appealing. The result of a song is not stated directly. They reach the level of where they need a real figure or idol and beautiful words that can influence their point of view so that one's identity can be described in a song lyric.

CHAPTER III

METHOD OF RESEARCH

This chapter contains the research design, highlighting the selection of songs, the rationale behind the chosen theoretical framework, and the steps taken to collect meticulous data. This chapter sets the stage for the exploration of the representation of the songwriter's identity as seen from the figurative meanings of Rich Brian's songs. In addition, an analysis of the findings is discussed in a brief explanation.

A. Research Design

This research was conducted by using descriptive design. This research used qualitative research methods because the sources of data are songs. Nazir (1998:34) states a descriptive qualitative method is one which is used to make a description of a situation, event, or accumulate the basic data. So, this research discusses figurative meaning which is expressed in songs and uses this research method to analyze the figurative meaning in Rich Brian's song's Lyrics

B. Data Source

The source data of this research is obtained from Rich Brian's songs. The analysis focused on figurative meaning in Rich Brian's song lyrics. In this case the researcher chooses twelve Rich Brian's songs from Spotify. The data is in the form of word, phrase, Sentence, contained of figurative meaning in the song which related to leech's theory. They are: personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbola, irony, litotes, metonymy and oxymoron.

C. The Technique of Collecting Data

The researcher collects the data in Spotify, after collecting the data from Spotify, the researcher listening the album (The sailor) of Rich Brian's songs, there are eight songs, such as yellow, kids, drive safe, confetti, vacant, no worries, Slow down turbo and 100 degrees in official Spotify by Rich Brian.

In addition. Next, after listening to the music, the researcher finding the sentence in every paragraph in the lyrics of songs which have figurative meaning in the lyrics of Rich Brian's songs. Then, the researcher highlighted the lyrics that include the types of figurative meaning in order to mark the lyrics. The function of this step is to make easy in classifying the data into ten types of figurative meaning. After that, the researcher classifies them into each type of figurative meaning such as: simile, metaphor, personification, hyperbole, irony, litotes, metonymy and oxymoron. Finally, the researcher checks the data and ready to analyze it.

D. Data Analysis

After getting the data from data source, the researcher did some steps to analyze the data. In doing the analysis the researcher uses procedures as follow: First, the researcher identified sentences of Rich Brian's songs that contained the types of figurative meaning. Second, the researcher analyzed the types of figurative meanings used the theory of figurative meaning by leech, The Data classified into eight types of figurative meanings Leech's theory, such as: simile, metaphor, personification, hyperbole, irony, litotes, metonymy and oxymoron. Third, after finding and the types figurative meaning in the lyrics of Rich Brian's songs, the researcher analyzed the function of figurative meanings used in the lyrics. The last step is drawing conclusion.

CHAPTER IV FINDING AND DISCUSSION

The chapter consist of findings of the research and its discussion. The findings are to answer the research question from this study. In addition, the findings are in the form of social and affective and analysis the function of figurative meanings of Rich Brian song lyrics. Additionally, an analysis of the findings is discussed in a brief explanation.

A. Findings

The data from this study were collected from the Rich Brian songs. The data for this study were collected and selected from the figurative meanings in The Sailor Album by the famous singer, Rich Brian. the songs from the album are entitled; Yellow, Kids, Drive Safe, Confetti, Vacant, No Worries, Slow Down Turbo, 100 Degrees. This data is presented based on the types of figurative meaning: personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbole, irony, metonymy, and oxymoron.

a. Personification

Personification is a literary device in which human characteristics or qualities are attributed to non-human things, such as objects, animals, or concepts. It is a type of figurative language that helps create a more vivid and imaginative depiction of these non-human entities. By giving them human qualities, personification allows readers to connect with and better relate to these objects or ideas. For example, "The wind whispered through the trees" is a personification because wind does not have the ability to whisper, but by attributing this human quality to it, the reader can better understand and visualize the way the wind moves.

Datum 1

Yellow

Don't fight the feeling 'cause I'm yellow

In this Datum. Rich Brian (formerly known as Rich Chigga) is an Indonesian-Chinese rapper who gained recognition in the American music industry. In this context, "yellow" is a reference to his Asian background. The lyric suggests that he is embracing and proud of his identity, encouraging others not to resist or deny it. The lyric included personification because that lyric used the word "feeling" that assigns feelings and awareness to the concept of feeling. So that the lyrics fall into personification.

Datum 2

Kids

Shout out my parents, my mother gave birth to four winners

Datum 2, In this lyric, Rich Brian is expressing gratitude and love for his parents, specifically his mother, for raising him and his siblings to be successful and accomplished individuals. He refers to himself and his siblings as "winners," which suggests that they have achieved their goals and are thriving in life, and he attributes this success to the guidance and support provided by their parents. It's a positive and appreciative message acknowledging the role his parents played in his upbringing and personal development. So that the lyric is included to personification because treating "parents" as if they actively participate in a competition.

Datum 3

Drive safe

Feeling left out from the pack, you gotta go rogue

In the context of the song, it could be about someone who doesn't fit in with a particular crowd or who feels different from their peers. The lyric suggests that when you're in such a situation, it's okay to embrace your uniqueness and forge your own path, even if it means going against the grain or doing things differently from others. It's a message of self-empowerment and self-acceptance. The lyric above included personification because it used word "rogue" the feeling of being left out is given the human quality of making a decision to go "rogue."

Datum 4

Vacant

I'm startin' to despise my reflection

This datum could be a reflection of a struggle with self-esteem, body image issues, or a more general sense of self-worth. Many people can relate to moments in their lives when they don't feel comfortable or confident in their own skin, and these lyric captures that feeling of discontentment with one's own reflection. The line might be expressing a desire for change or self-improvement, as well as the emotional weight of dealing with these negative self-perceptions. The lyric of "I'm startin' to despise my reflection" personifies the speaker's reflection, indicating self-loathing or a negative self-image.

Datum 5

No worries

Breakin' down, I'm barely breathin

This lyric suggests a sense of emotional or psychological struggle. It conveys the feeling of being overwhelmed, on the verge of collapsing, or feeling emotionally drained to the point of struggling to keep going. The lyric above included personification because the idea of the speaker "breaking down" and "barely breathing" is attributed to a non-human entity (emotion, situation), personifying their emotional struggle.

Datum 6

Slod down turbo

Face is hurtin' from the smiles, it's time to keep it real

Conveys a sense of exhaustion or discomfort from pretending to be happy or putting on a fake smile. It suggests that the person has been pretending to be happy or putting on a facade for others, and it's becoming tiring or painful. The phrase "it's time to keep it real" implies that the person is ready to be authentic and honest instead of hiding their true feelings behind a smile. It may reflect a desire for authenticity and a break from pretending. Face is hurtin' from the smiles, it's time to keep it real is personification because "Face is hurtin' from the smiles" gives emotions to the face.

Datum 7

Slod down turbo

Your mirror broke 'cause it saw what's in front of it

The "mirror" represents societal or external expectations and judgments. When someone or something (society, peers, etc.) looks at a person, it can "break" them because of the pressure to meet certain standards or conform to certain ideals. In this sense, the lyric can be about the challenges of dealing with external pressures and expectations. Your mirror broke 'cause it saw what's in front of it is personification because the mirror's actions imply consciousness.

Datum 8

100 Degrees

moonlight glows

Moonlight is often associated with romance and beauty. "Moonlight glows" could be describing a scene where the moonlight is casting a soft and gentle glow, creating a romantic or picturesque atmosphere. The lyric

above included personification because "moonlight glows" gives humanlike qualities to the moonlight.

From the data analyzed above, the author found personification in the lyrics. From the first song "Yellow" there is 1 personification, in the second song "Kids" there is 1 personification, in the third song "Drive safe" there is 1 personification, in the fourth song "Vacant" there is 1 personification, in the fifth song "No worries" there is 1 personification, in the sixth song "Slow down turbo" there are 2 personifications and in the 7th song "100 degrees" there is 1 personification so the total personification is 8 personifications.

b. Simile

A simile is a figure of speech that involves comparing two things using the words "like" or "as" to make a descriptive or vivid comparison. It helps the reader or listener to understand or visualize something by comparing it to something else. For example, "Her smile was as bright as the sun" or "His voice was like velvet."

Datum 1

Yellow

Don't need no ice

"Don't need no ice" also be an expression of self-confidence. In the context of the song, it could be Rich Brian asserting that he doesn't need external symbols of success or validation to feel good about himself. He's secure in who he is and doesn't rely on material things to define his worth. "Don't need no ICE" is simile because it used word feel like I'm 21, Feel like I'm 21" compares the feeling to being young.

Datum 2

Drive Safe

'Cause I just wanna feel your touch / 'Cause I don't think I had enough

The song lyrics can be subjective, as they often rely on personal feelings and experiences. However, based on the provided lyrics, it seems to convey a desire for physical and emotional connection. The singer expresses a longing for someone's touch, suggesting a need for closeness and intimacy. The phrase " 'Cause I don't think I had enough" implies that the singer may have had a taste of this connection but feels it wasn't sufficient or fulfilling, so they want more of it. Overall, the lyrics suggest a yearning for the warmth and comfort of another person's presence. The lyric "'Cause I just wanna feel your touch / 'Cause I don't think I had enough" shows that the sentence is simile, The desire to feel a touch is compared using the simile "like I don't think I had enough.

Datum 3

Drive Safe

I never go away like a hiccup, I'm far from finished

Hiccups are temporary and annoying interruptions, but they eventually go away. In contrast, the singer is expressing that they are not going away or giving up easily. They are far from being finished, which could imply that they have a lot more to achieve or prove, and they won't be deterred by temporary setbacks or obstacles. It's a message of perseverance and confidence in their abilities to overcome challenges and continue forward. The lyric above is simile because the idea of never going away is compared using the simile "like a hiccup.

Datum 4

Confetti

Always lookin' like the perfect blend

The song likely conveys a sense of admiration or attraction towards someone who consistently appears to be a perfect combination or mix of qualities. The speaker may be referring to a person who has a harmonious balance of physical and/or personality traits, and they find this person to be very appealing or impressive. It could also suggest that this person seems effortlessly put together or attractive in every way. The interpretation may vary depending on the context of the song and the surrounding lyrics. Always lookin' like the perfect blend" uses a simile to compare the speaker's appearance or demeanor to a "perfect blend."

Datum 5

The lyric conveys that Rich Brian is driven by his genuine love and passion for his work, which is why he continues to pursue it despite any challenges or obstacles. It's a testament to his dedication and commitment to his craft, and how his passion fuels his motivation to keep going. In essence, he's saying that his love for what he does is so strong that it sustains him and keeps him motivated to continue working hard in his chosen field. The lyric above is simile because the comparison of "loving" something to every second emphasizes the intensity of the love.

Datum 6

No worries

Oh, been on fire but my heart is cold

The song likely suggests a feeling of inner conflict or emotional disconnect. It conveys the idea that someone has experienced intense or passionate moments ("been on fire") but still feels emotionally distant or detached ("my heart is cold"). This contrast between external enthusiasm or excitement and internal emotional detachment can be interpreted in various ways, such as feeling numb or jaded despite outward appearances of vitality. The lyric may reflect a sense of inner turmoil or a struggle to reconcile one's emotions with their external demeanor. Walkin' 'round, I'm feelin' like a fully-loaded weapon

The song suggests a feeling of confidence, empowerment, and readiness to face challenges or obstacles. The comparison to a "fully-loaded weapon" implies that the person feels prepared and equipped to take on whatever comes their way. It can be interpreted as a metaphor for someone who is self-assured and ready to tackle life's challenges with determination and strength. This type of imagery is often used in hip-hop and rap music to convey a sense of power and assertiveness. Walkin' 'round, I'm feelin' like a fully-loaded weapon because it comparing their confidence and presence to a dangerous weapon.

Datum 10

100 Degrees

We just here to be free It don't feel like this often

In this lyric, Rich Brian seems to be expressing a sense of freedom and happiness in the present moment. He is emphasizing the rarity of feeling this way, suggesting that life is often filled with challenges, restrictions, and moments where one doesn't feel as free or content. However, in this specific moment, he and the people he's referring to are experiencing a sense of liberation and joy. It's a celebration of the feeling of being carefree and living in the present, which can be rare and precious. This lyric could also be seen as a call to appreciate and savor these moments of freedom when they do come, as they might not be frequent occurrences in life. The lyric is

simile because "It don't feel like this often" compares the infrequent feeling of freedom to some unspecified contrasting situation.

From the data analysed above, the author found similes in the lyrics. From the first song "Yellow" there is 1 simile, in the second song "Drive safe" there are 2 similes, in the third song "confetti" there is 1 simile, in the fourth song "No worries" there are 2 similes, in the fifth song "Slow down turbo "There are 3 similes, in the sixth song "100 Degrees", so the total is 8 similes.

c. Metaphor

metaphor is a figure of speech that compares two things by stating that one thing is another, even though they are not literally the same. It is used to create a vivid image or to convey a certain idea or emotion in a more engaging way. For example, saying "Time is money" is a metaphor that implies time is as valuable and precious as money.

Datum 1

Yellow

How do I disappear

The lyric conveys a feeling of wanting to disconnect or distance oneself from something, whether it's emotional or physical. This theme of wanting to disappear or escape can be related to feelings of isolation, uncertainty, or the pressures of life. The repetition of the phrase emphasizes the idea that this desire to disappear is a persistent thought or feeling in the songwriter's mind. The lyric above included metaphor because the lyric the act of disappearing is compared to becoming unseen or unnoticed. From the lyrics above it is a metaphor because it was constructed directly by the author to provide an image of his feelings.

Datum 2

"I'm drown tonight" convey a sense of feeling overwhelmed or drowning in one's emotions or circumstances. It could represent a moment of emotional turmoil or difficulty in the songwriter's life, suggesting that he's dealing with some heavy emotions or challenges. The lyric above included metaphor because in the word "Drown Bury me a legend" implies achieving greatness even in death. "Tonight" suggests being overwhelmed by emotions or circumstances.

Bury me a legend, I'm dig the grave myself

The first part, "Bury me a legend," suggests that the songwriter wants to be remembered as someone exceptional or legendary in their chosen profession or in life in general. They want to leave a mark that people will remember. The lyric above included metaphor because in the word "bury me a legend" implies achieving greatness even in death.

The lyric is metaphor because describing the current state as "before pictures" implies that greater success is yet to come.

This part likely refers to individuals who are actively participating in a competitive field, such as the music industry. The "players" could represent songwriters, performers, or people trying to succeed in their respective careers. The lyric include metaphor because the lyric Referring to life as a game and comparing inaction to sitting on cold benches.

Datum 9

They said the fruit never gon' fall far from the tree

The lyric could be used to express a sense of inevitability or the feeling of being judged or held to certain expectations based on one's family background. It can also reflect a desire to break away from those expectations and be one's own person, forging their own path regardless of what others may expect or assume based on their family history. The lyric of "they said fruit never gon' fall from the tree" is metaphor because comparing the songwriter's success to the fruit falling close to the tree of their upbringing.

Datum 10

The lyric "If my vision ain't scarin' me, then I don't go for it" from Rich Brian's song suggests a message of embracing challenges and pushing one's boundaries. In this context, "vision" likely refers to one's dreams, goals, or aspirations. The songwriter is expressing that if their goals or dreams don't make them feel a sense of fear or uncertainty, they are not ambitious enough. They believe in taking risks and pursuing goals that are outside their comfort zone. From the first song "Yellow" there are 6 metaphors, in the second song "Kids" there are 7 metaphors, in the third song "Drive safe" there are 12 metaphors, in the fourth song "Confetti" there are 8 metaphors, in the fifth song "Vacant" there are 4 metaphors, in the sixth song "No worries" there are 6 metaphors and in the 7th song "Slow down turbo" there are 10 metaphors, in the 8th song "100 Degrees" there are 5 metaphors, so a total of 57 metaphors.

d. **Hyperbole**

A hyperbole is a figure of speech in which the author makes an obvious exaggeration to create a rhetorical effect and deforms facts by making them appear much bigger than they are if looked at objectively. As Perrine (1992) says, it is an overstatement that is in the service of truth. It is used to create humor and sensational effect to make ideas more manipulative hence exploiting the listener. For example, If I can't buy phone, I will crazy.

Datum 1

Yellow

Bottle full of liquor

In "Bottle Full of Liquor," Rich Brian raps about indulging in alcohol and the lifestyle associated with it. The lyrics seem to depict a scene where he is enjoying a party or social gathering with friends, with a bottle of liquor as a central element of the party. The song touches on themes of hedonism, partying, and the allure of temporary escapism through alcohol. The lyric of "Bottle full of liquor" is hyperbole because exaggerates the amount of alcohol consumed.

The use of numbers and digits can symbolize both the chart rankings or accomplishments in his career (numbers on the board) and the increasing amount of money he is earning (blowing more digits, where "digits" might be a reference to the digits in large sums of money). I'm puttin' numbers on the board and blowin' more digits is hyperbole because exaggerating the idea of achieving immense success.

Datum 7

Kids

Been in the studio, I forgot how to sleep

The lyric suggests that the songwriter has been working tirelessly in the recording studio, likely creating music or working on his craft. He has been so dedicated and immersed in his work that he has forgotten or neglected his need for sleep. This can be interpreted as a common theme in the music industry where songwriters often work long hours and sacrifice rest to pursue their creative goals. It reflects a commitment to their craft and a willingness to put in the hard work necessary to achieve their musical ambitions. The lyric may also convey a sense of passion and dedication to the creative process. The lyric include hyperbole because emphasizing the songwriter's dedication and hard work.

The lyric suggests a somewhat casual and hedonistic attitude toward intimate relationships. In this context, "vibes" likely refers to the overall atmosphere or chemistry between two people. The line implies that the speaker is engaging in sexual activity primarily for the pleasure, connection, or excitement it brings, rather than seeking a deeper emotional or romantic connection. It's a straightforward and unapologetic expression of a more casual approach to physical intimacy. Keep in mind that the meaning of song lyrics can be subjective and open to interpretation, and the songwriter's intent may vary. "I'm only fucking for the vibes" employs hyperbole to emphasize the speaker's casual attitude towards relationships.

It could be a declaration of independence and a desire for freedom from external constraints or criticism. It reflects a casual, non-committal attitude towards relationships "No, I never cuff a basic, only fuck 'em on occasion" the lyric is hyperbole because exaggerating the speaker's disdain for "basic" people by using "cuff" and "only fuck 'em on occasion" creates hyperbolic imagery.

The lyric suggests that the person mentioned in the song doesn't require convincing or persuasion to be with the singer. This person has already expressed that the singer is their favorite, which implies a strong attraction or affection. The lyric conveys a sense of confidence and assurance in the romantic or personal relationship described in the song, as the singer feels secure in the other person's feelings for them. Overall, it portrays a positive and reassuring aspect of the relationship. "She doesn't ever need persuasion, 'Cause she said that I'm her favorite" the lyric is Hyperbolic portrayal of the person's admiration by suggesting they don't need any persuasion to consider the speaker their favorite.

Datum 31

Slow Down turbo

I won't ever quit, I was born to be the shit, ayy

The lyric suggests that the speaker is determined and resilient. They are not willing to give up or back down, even in the face of challenges or obstacles. "I was born to be the shit" reflects a strong self-belief and a sense of destiny. The word "shit" in this context is slang for being excellent or successful. The speaker is essentially saying that they were destined to be great or achieve success. The lyric include hyperbole because exaggerating determination and self-confidence

Datum 32

Slow Down turbo

I been in the booth like, 'Who the fuck I gotta kill?

This lyric might suggest that Rich Brian is willing to put in the effort and energy required to excel in the music industry, even if it means hyperbole "killing" the competition or surpassing others in his field. It's a common theme in many rap songs to express a competitive and ambitious mindset, and this lyric is likely a reflection of that mindset. The lyric is hyperbole because exaggerating the intensity of their dedication.

Winter jacket on me, I love when it's cold out

As lyrics in songs often are. However, it appears to express a preference for colder weather and the act of wearing a winter jacket. This might imply that he's selective about the songs he releases and wants to ensure they meet a certain standard of quality before sharing them. "I got hella songs inside the vault that I already made" this hyperbole because exaggerating the number of unreleased songs

Datum 37

Slow Down turbo

Yeah, we gon' deliver this in five business days

In a broader sense, this line might not necessarily refer to a concrete delivery schedule but could be symbolic of a promise or commitment to fulfill something or achieve a goal within a reasonable time frame. It may convey a sense of determination and assurance. "Yeah, we gon' deliver this in five business days" mocking the idea of quick delivery for creative output.

Datum 38

100 Degrees

It's a hundred degrees Why you feelin' down? What's the problem?

The interpretation could be that the speaker is trying to encourage the other person to look on the bright side of things and not let external factors like the weather bring them down. They may be asking, "What's the problem?" to inquire about the source of the person's unhappiness and encourage them to focus on the positive aspects of the day. "The temperature being described as "a hundred degrees" might be an exaggeration to emphasize the heat and discomfort

Datum 39

100 Degrees

Turnin' up the music when we get a lil' too loud

The lyric implies that when the people in the song become too noisy or wild, they respond by turning up the music. This action serves as a distraction or a way to drown out the noise they are making or to mask their boisterous behavior. It can be seen as a way to have fun and let loose while avoiding concerns about being too disruptive or bothersome. "a lil' too loud" exaggerates the volume level for emphasis.

From the data analysed above, the author found hyperbole in the lyrics. From the first song "Yellow" there are 5 hyperboles, in the second song "Kids" there are 5 hyperboles, in the third song "Drive safe" there are 5 hyperboles, in the fourth song "Confetti" there are 9 hyperboles, in the fifth song "No worries" there are 6 hyperboles, in the sixth song "Slow down turbo" there are 7 hyperboles and in the 7th song "100 Degrees" there are 2 hyperboles, so the total is 39 hyperboles.

e. Irony

Irony consists of using words in a sense very different from their usual meaning (S. Kane, 1988:313). Irony is the use of words to convey the opposite of their literal meaning; a statement or situation where the meaning is contradicted by the appearance or presentation of the idea.

Irony can divide into soft irony and hard irony, soft irony usually used as humor and hard irony usually used as sarcastic. For example, when you dance, your dance is very good, it makes me want to go when you dance.

Datum 1

Yellow

Life looks so easy, all you gotta do is close your eyes

In this lyric, the singer seems to be expressing a sense of disillusionment or frustration with life. The phrase "Life looks so easy" suggests that from an external perspective, life may appear simple or uncomplicated. However, the line "all you gotta do is close your eyes" adds a layer of complexity to this sentiment. Closing one's eyes is often associated with blocking out the external world and retreating into one's own thoughts or imagination. So, it could be interpreted as a way of coping or escaping from the challenges and difficulties of life. The singer may be highlighting the idea that it's easy to escape into one's own mind to avoid the complexities of reality, but this doesn't necessarily make life truly "easy." Contrasts the idea that life is easy with the implied difficulty of the speaker's own life.

Datum 2

Yellow

Please don't call the reverend, I don't need no help

This lyric could express a desire for independence and self-reliance. The speaker is essentially saying that they don't need outside assistance, especially from a religious figure like a reverend. It could be about the speaker's self-confidence and belief in their ability to handle their own problems or make their own decisions. Irony arises from refusing help while in a vulnerable state.

Yellow

Don't try to save my life

Interpreting this lyric within the context of the song, it may suggest a willingness to face personal issues and struggles head-on, even if it means making mistakes or experiencing difficulties. The song seems to convey a sense of personal growth and the acknowledgment that one must navigate their own path, even if it involves hardships. It's a call for self-reliance and self-discovery, encouraging the listener to take ownership of their life's journey. The speaker declines help despite feeling overwhelmed.

Datum 4

Yellow

They don't love you when you're wrong

This lyric might be conveying the idea that people tend to love or appreciate you when you're doing well or when you're presenting a positive image, but they may not be as supportive or loving when you make mistakes or show vulnerability. It could emphasize the importance of being true to oneself and not pretending to be perfect to gain acceptance. The statement contradicts the typical idea of love and support.

This lyric reflects the common thing of transformation and the impact of fame and success on an individual's life. It's a commentary on the change in perception and the influence that can come with achieving a high

level of recognition in the music industry or any field. Highlighting the reversal of roles where the songwriter, once aspiring, is now the role model.

Datum 6

You hatin' on me, but you know I gotta

In this context, "gotta" is short for "have got to" or "have to," indicating a sense of obligation or determination to follow a certain path or make a particular choice, even in the face of criticism or opposition. It's worth noting that lyrics in music can be open to interpretation, and listeners may find their own personal meanings and connections to the words based on their own experiences and perspectives. Contradicting the desire to not discuss an issue by discussing it repeatedly.

In the context of the song, it may reflect a sense of impatience or longing for a particular goal, dream, or destination in life. The songwriter might be questioning whether they've reached their desired point or if they're getting closer to it. The lyric could also be interpreted in a more philosophical or existential sense. The constant questioning of whether one has arrived at a meaningful or fulfilling point in life can be a reflection of the human condition. It raises questions about the journey and the destination in the broader sense of existence. The repetition of the classic child's question "Are we there yet?" is used ironically to reflect the speaker's impatience with life's progress.

"You ain't ever talk about our good moments" uses litotes to convey that the other person rarely mentions positive experiences.

No worries

If it feels like a job, then why you still doin' it?

The lyric is emphasizing the importance of pursuing one's passions and interests rather than simply going through the motions. It suggests that when you're truly passionate about something, it won't feel like a job, and you'll be more motivated to continue doing it. The use of litotes with an understatement ("if it feels like a job") highlights the fact that the speaker might be feeling overwhelmed or dissatisfied.

Datum 10

No worries

Bitch, I feel extravagant

The lyric "Bitch, I feel extravagant" from the song "No Worries" by Rich Brian can be interpreted as an expression of confidence and self-assuredness. In this context, "extravagant" is used to convey a sense of luxury, opulence, or grandeur. The use of the word "bitch" in this lyric is a colloquial and often assertive expression that can be seen as a way of emphasizing the speaker's confidence and disregard for concerns or worries. The use of the word "extravagant" with a negative qualifier "I feel" serves as litotes to understate the speaker's emotions.

Datum 11

Slow down turbo

I ain't got no

This lyric is litotes because "I ain't got no" the lyric is a double negative, downplaying possessions. The Song writer may be expressing that

he doesn't have something he desire or need. This could be related to various aspects of life, such as material possessions, emotional fulfillment, or personal achievements.

Datum 12

100 Degrees

No, we don't give a fuck

In this context, it suggests an attitude of not caring about what others think or say. The artist is expressing a sense of confidence and independence, indicating that they are not concerned with external opinions or judgments. It's a common theme in many hip-hop and rap songs, where artists often convey a sense of self-assuredness and a disregard for societal norms or expectations. "We don't give a fuck" is a form of litotes, using negative understatement to emphasize a strong feeling of indifference.

From the data analysed above, the author found litotes in the lyrics. From the first song "Yellow" there is 1 litotes, in the second song "Kids" there are 3 litotes, in the third song "Drive safe" there are 1 litotes, in the fourth song "Confetti" there are 1 litotes, in the fifth song "Vacant" there are 2 Irony, in the sixth song "No worries" there are 2 litotes, in the 7th song "Slow down turbo" there is 1 Irony and in the 8th song "100 Degrees" there is 1 litotes, so the total is 12 litotes.

g. Metonymy

According to Dale in Tarigan (1985:139) stated that metonymy comes from Greeks word which is Meta means switch and Metonymy means name. Metonymy is a figure of speech where the name of one thing is replaced with the name of something that is closely associated with it. A name transfer takes place to demonstrate an association of a part or how two things are associated in some way. This allows the reader to recognize

similarities or common features among terms. For example, they has Marlboro in their pocket- Marlboro means cigarette.

Datum 1

Yellow

Will, anybody even miss me When I'm gone

The interpretation of this lyric suggests feelings of insecurity and a desire for validation or recognition from others. The singer is expressing doubt about whether their presence or absence would have any impact on those around them. It conveys a sense of longing for connection and a fear of being forgotten or unimportant to the people in their life. This lyric reflects themes of self-worth, loneliness, and the human need for connection and recognition. It's a common sentiment that many people can relate to, as it touches on the universal desire to be valued and missed by those we care about "Miss me" refers to being remembered or valued.

Datum 2

Yellow

You want my soul but we don't sell those

The lyric could be seen as a rejection of someone or something that is trying to take advantage of the singer. The "soul" can be symbolic of one's innermost self, individuality, or essence. By saying "we don't sell those," the singer may be expressing that they are not willing to compromise their true self or integrity for external gain or influence. This lyric also conveys the importance of staying true to oneself. The singer may be highlighting that they value their inner integrity and identity more than any external temptations or pressures to conform. It can be seen as an assertion of individuality and a refusal to compromise their values or principles. "My soul" symbolizes the speaker's essence or identity.

Kids

My name is Brian; cold bars is what I'm known for

The lyric "My name is Brian; cold bars is what I'm known for" from the song "Kids" by Rich Brian is a statement by the artist, Rich Brian (whose real name is Brian Imanuel), introducing himself and claiming that he is known for delivering "cold bars." In the context of hip-hop and rap music, "bars" refer to the lines of lyrics in a verse. "Cold bars" typically means that the artist is known for delivering powerful, impactful, and skillful lyrics. It suggests that Rich Brian is recognized for his lyrical prowess and his ability to craft impressive and memorable verses. Essentially, it's a declaration of his confidence in his rap skills and a way of asserting his reputation as a skilled rapper. The lyric is metonymy because using "cold bars" to refer to the songwriter's skillful and impactful lyrics.

Datum 4

Kids

These rappers tryna make the trendin' topi

In this lyric, Rich Brian is commenting on the trend in the rap industry where many rappers are trying to follow the latest trends and create music that is popular or "trending" at the moment. The term "topi" is likely a play on words, referring to the top or trending topics in the music industry. Brian may be expressing his frustration or criticism towards other rappers who prioritize following trends over creating authentic and original music. This lyric is metonymy because using "trendin' topic" to represent popular and fleeting subjects in music.

Kids

I write the lyrics meant for the captions

This lyric could be interpreted as Rich Brian recognizing the impact of his music on his audience, especially younger people who use his lyrics to convey their own feelings and experiences. It's a way of saying that his music resonates with the younger generation and that he's aware of his influence as an artist. The song as a whole explores themes of growing up, the challenges and choices faced by young people, and the sense of unity and shared experiences among the youth. The lyric is metonymy because referring to the songwriter's lyrics as captions, highlighting their relatable nature

Datum 6

Dive safe

The lyric may convey a sense of loneliness or isolation that people often feel during the weekends when they have more free time. "Being on the road" in the context of the music industry typically means touring and traveling extensively. The lyric implies that the speaker has been on tour for an extended period, 50 days, which is quite a long time. The lyric conveys a sense of a fast and busy life filled with money and constant travel. It's not necessarily meant to be taken literally but rather as an expression of the lifestyle often associated with the music industry, with an emphasis on

the demanding and sometimes exhausting nature of the artist's life. "50 bands" represents money", on road like 50 days" indicates constant travel.

Datum 17

Slow down turbo

Your girl already knows the Wi-Fi at my place

Overall, the interpretation of this lyric is that it captures a scene of fun and relaxation. "Old school" is a metonymy for old-fashioned or classic music.

h. Oxymoron

An oxymoron is a figure of speech that aligns the elements that seem extraordinary. Oxymoron is a paradoxical combination of words or expressions with opposite that is more or less straightforwardly antonymic senses (Alm- Arvius, 2003:134). For example, beautifully painful.

Datum 1

Kids

Fuck bein' one the greatest, I'm tryna be the greatest one

In this lyric, Rich Brian seems to be expressing a mindset where he is not satisfied with simply being great or one of the greats; he wants to surpass all others and become the absolute best in his field or at what he does. It suggests a level of determination and competitiveness, where he's not content with settling for second place or being among the top

performers. Instead, he is driven to reach the very pinnacle of success and become the "greatest one." This lyric conveys a sense of relentless pursuit of greatness and a refusal to be complacent with anything less. The lyric is oxymoron because contrasting the idea of being "the greatest" with being "the greatest one," implying uniqueness.

Datum 2

Drive safe

The smiles turn to frowns quick

The lyric "The smiles turn to frowns quick" from Rich Brian's song "Drive Safe" suggests a sudden shift from happiness or contentment to sadness or disappointment. In this context, it could imply that something initially positive or joyful has taken a negative or unfortunate turn. This can be a common theme in many songs, where the artist may be expressing the idea that life can change unexpectedly or that relationships can go from good to bad in a short amount of time. The song as a whole may provide more context and depth to the interpretation of this lyric. The contradictory terms "smiles" and "frowns" create an oxymoron, emphasizing a sudden shift in emotion.

I ain't got no red Lamborghini, no bubbles in my bottle

In this line, Rich Brian is essentially saying that he doesn't have a red Lamborghini (a luxury sports car) and he doesn't have champagne or sparkling wine in his bottle. This can be interpreted as Rich Brian may be addressing the common theme of materialism in hip-hop culture. He's acknowledging that he doesn't possess the extravagant, flashy items that are often associated with success and wealth in the music industry. "No bubbles in my bottle" contradicts the expectation of luxurious champagne. "Damn, this is easy, but baby, I'm gon' run 'em"

Datum 5

100 Degrees

lights look pretty

"Lights look pretty" could simply be an expression of the beauty and visual appeal of the lights being described. The singer admiring the way the lights look, creating a vivid and pleasing visual image. "Lights look pretty" could be seen as an oxymoron due to the contrasting elements of light (which is typically visually appealing) and the description of them as "pretty."

Datum 6

100 Degrees

We just all in the moment, 'cause

The lyric "We just all in the moment, "cause" from the song "100 Degrees" by Rich Brian suggests a sense of living in the present and fully

embracing the moment. In this context, it implies that the people in the song are not worrying about the past or the future; instead, they are fully engaged and enjoying the current moment or experience. It's about being present and not overthinking things, just going with the flow and enjoying the moment as it is, perhaps with a carefree or spontaneous attitude. This kind of sentiment is common in many songs and reflects a desire for living in the present moment and making the most of it. "All in the moment" could be seen as an oxymoron due to the contrast between "all in" (fully engaged) and "the moment" (transitory).

B. Discussion

After conducting analysis, researchers found the types of figurative meanings used in Rich Brian's songs. There are several types of figurative meaning used in Rich Brian's Song lyrics, including: personification, simile, metaphor, hyperbole, irony, litotes, metonymy and oxymoron.

"The Sailor" is an album by Indonesian rapper Rich Brian, released in 2019. The album title refers to Brian's journey and experiences navigating through life, both personally and professionally. While it doesn't solely focus on one aspect of his life, it intricately weaves together various themes that reflect his growth, challenges, and aspirations. "The Sailor" metaphorically represents Rich Brian's journey through life, navigating through challenges and self-discovery. The sailor is a symbol of resilience, adventure, and the willingness to explore uncharted waters. The album explores themes such as success, fame, relationships, and the impact of Rich Brian's cultural background on his identity.

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

This study examines the types of figurative meaning in Rich Brian song lyrics. This research aims to examine the types of figurative meaning in Rich Brian found in his song lyrics

Based on the result of the study, the researcher founds the types of figurative meaning in Rich Brian's song lyrics. The researchers found the types of figurative meaning used in Rich Brian's songs. There are several types of figurative language used in Rich Brian's Song lyrics, including: personification 8, simile 8, metaphor 57, hyperbole 37, irony 51, litotes 12, metonymy 19 and oxymoron 6. The most dominant figurative meanings found in this research is Metaphor and the total is 57 Metaphor.

B. Suggestion

This chapter provides suggestions for future scholars interested in conducting analyzes on the topic of figurative meaning. The object of this research is Rich Brian's song, which is a human work, of course it has limitations. The figurative meaning contained in this song is emotional or a message conveyed to the listener, meaning that the figurative meaning contained in the song is a message or information conveyed to the listener. But with some limitations. This study only cover determine identity from figurative meaning, for further researchers it is suggested to dig up other value for example social value, and humanity value that are determined from figurative meaning in poetry or speech on Gaza tragedy today.
