

ABSTRACT

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All individuals, both of male and women have emotions-experienced. In order not to harm others due to the emotions we experience, the individual should be able to control any emotions they have felt. And in expressing it, it's also expected to be more rational in accordance with the existing norms. The reaction is called as the Emotional Maturity. Emotional maturity is the ability of individuals to critically assess the situation before having a reaction emotionally, no more reacting without thinking ahead of time as a child or as an immature person, so that would cause an emotional reaction that is stable and does not change from one emotion or emotion directly or mood to another mood. Individual is said to have reached the emotional maturity if the individual itself is able to control his emotions in accordance with the level of development. In the MCL community phenomenon (Malang Cat Lovers) on male members they have not been able to control his emotions, while the female members are able to control her emotions. From this spawned some formulation of the problem, namely (1) How emotional maturity men in the community MCL? (2) How emotional maturity MCL women in the community? (3) Are there differences between emotional maturity of male and female in the MCL community ?

The purpose of this study is (1) To determine the emotional maturity of men in Community MCL, (2) To determine the emotional maturity of women in Community MCL, (3) To know is there any difference between emotional maturity male and female in the Community MCL.

In this study, using a quantitative approach and the type of comparison, it is comparing. The subjects in this study were members of the Community MCL (Malang Cat Lovers). Sampling technique in this study was the random sampling. So that the variable or fixed members have an equal opportunity to be sampled

The results of this study showed that there are differences between emotional maturity of male and female. From the t-test analysis, the value $0.662 > 0.05$, which means that there are significant differences between both of emotions, with a mean ratio of 59.7200 (female) : 55.7200 (male).
